Executive Summary

Introduction:

Rashtramata Indira Gandhi Arts, Commerce and Science College, Jalna (27th August, 1991) is run by **Bhagwan Shikshan Prasarak Mandal, Georai, Dist. Beed** (established in 1984). President Hon'ble Dr. Narayanrao Mundhe erected '**Mandal Stambh'** (Pillar) at Dodadgaon, Dist. Jalna as a monument of social justice (In memoire of V. P. Singh's Mandal Commission recommendations). The college commenced as women's college initially, it turned into Co-education College in 1992 with three programs B. A., B. Com., and B. Sc. However, due to unavailability of Full-fledged faculty and students B. Com. programme was stopped in 2002.

The college is permanently affiliated to **Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathadwada University, Aurangabad**. The college is working with the aim to provide education to the socially, economically deprived students and minority students. The aim is also area specific; students from rural, and slum areas take admission because of location of college in the heart of the city, affordable fees and treatment of equality. Hence, the college is recognized as a centre of social activity in Jalna. After pandemic year, students' admissions are severely affected this year.

We are bound to impart quality education through well documented, systematic academic working so as to transform India into a strong nation. In the global scenario, traditional education faces many issues such as unemployment, lack of skill-oriented curriculum, drop outs is a hindrance to progress. Curricular Aspects :

Rashtramata Indira Gandhi Arts, Commerce and Science College Jalna is permanently affiliated to Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad. At initial stage, the college was established in 1991 by Hon. Dr. Narayanrao Mundhe, President with the vision **Education will Provide the Social Justice.** We run BA and B. Sc.programs.

The college has become a centre of excellence for the minority, reservation who were unable to take the education. The college provides the facility of lowest fees which they can afford. The college implements the defined curriculum by the affiliating university in well manner through academic planning which includes preparation of academic calendar, preparation of teaching plan, preparation of time-table, providing notes to students, conductions of regular based tests for the students and work for overall development of the students. To implement the defined syllabus and structure of the affiliating university, the college plans academic meetings of all the faculty and HoDs at the beginning of each academic year to take review of previous year's result and outcomes. In this meeting the planning for upcoming year is discussed and academic calendar is prepared after this meeting. The timetable, the workload distribution, the teaching plan, daily dairy preparation, notes preparation, the

tentative schedules of internal examination etc. all things are covered in the academic calendar of the college. Prepared academic calendars are displayed on the college notice board and the college website. Students are made well aware about the syllabus structure, the pattern of internal and external examination by all the subject teachers. Some teachers are appointed for design and development of curriculum by affiliating university. Some teachers are appointed for the paper setting of question papers, maximum is appointed assessment and evaluation process of the affiliating University. The college runs elective pattern for running the program. There are a number of units and subunits concerned with cross cutting issues, gender issues are included in the syllabus of languages, Social Sciences like Political Science, History and Sociology. Collection of the timely and regular basis feedback, analysis and action taken report are prepared annually and regularly. Effective monitoring is done by the authorities.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation :

Rashtramata Indira Gandhi Arts, Commerce and Science College is permenantly affiliated to Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University, Aurangabad. For the admission of all two programs. The college strictly follows the rules and regulations of reservation policies for the admission to SC, ST, OBC, Divyangjan, etc. students defined by UGC and The State Government of Maharashtra and affiliating University. Well qualified teaching staff is appointed by the college. Almost, all the full -time teachers are well qualified with having Ph.D degree. The college takes special efforts for all students and identifies their acquisition level through defining the attainment level of the students through defining and analyzing course outcomes and program outcomes. Teachers and students are aware of the stated Programme and course outcomes. They are measured through mapping tool using blooms taxonomy, seven scale measurement tool and graphical analysis. The college believes in overall development of the students, hence, student centric activities and experimental learning methods is are used by all teacher as, guiz competition, group discussion, interview techniques, presentation skills techniques to develop analytical ability, emotional quotient, high self-esteem, scientific temper and decision-making ability among students etc. are conducted. The use of ICT tools as LCD Projector, laptop, computers and mobiles are used. They use Zoom, google meet, Webex, telegram etc. platforms for online teaching and communication with students. Whatsapp. E-mail, SMS etc social media as well as Power point presentation, Youtube video lectures, E-notes, Question bank for all courses etc. are used by the entire teacher as the need of using ICT as supporting educational tools. The students' betterment, the mentor-mentee scheme is run by the college. The mechanism of evaluation is transparent either it is of internal assessment or university examination assessment. Students are supported for all kinds of grievances related to examination as their doubts for the marks, their demand of true copy of answer sheet etc.

Research, Innovations and Extension :

The college believes in the continuous improvement process. Hence, teachers are motivated for the research. The Self Study Report of Rashtramata Indira Gandhi Arts, Commerce and Science College, Jalna based work and the projects of few teachers are sanctioned by the affiliating university. All the teachers and departments conduct FDP and conference as the part of research work. Faculty members are encouraged to work in the research area and publish their work in reputed journals, books and proceedings. The college conducts several extension activities for the nearby locality to make them aware about their role and create impact and sensitizing amongst students about social issues, the NSS department actively works various activities through the medium of seven days with organization of special camp in Dev Pimpalagon. Waste management in the surrounding of school & on the way to village, care of plants, sanitation, Literacy Program, Swachta Abhiyan, Health Camp, Clean house, beautiful house Competition, Agriculture and social work were done in rural area etc. special activities are conducted by the NSS departments of the college as extension activities for the social awareness. During the covid-19, pandemic situation, the college worked to create the awareness amongst all the stockholders about preventive measurements and taking care of self and others through using mask, sanitizers, maintaining distance etc. Various social activities are performed in the college & nearby locality of the college. Social awareness is created through these extension activities such as Awareness regarding duties & responsibilities, Women Empowerment, Eradication of Superstitions, Helping hand for rural development etc. The college has active MoUs with several organizations and it has conducted collaborative activities as well the linkage activities.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources :

Ltd facility and 12 Computers are used for student in Computer Lab with 40 MBPS speed of Wi-fi . The college used Late. Shrimantrao Mundhe open Auditorium with measuring area is 6250 square feet for taking various types of cultural programmes as Gathering , Ifthar party, Debating Completion, Social Justice Lecturer Sherries etc.

We have 02 LCD Projector, 02 printers, 03 scanner, 01 Digital Camera, 01 Xerox Machine, 11 CCTV Cameras and 01 Inverter for institute use in various condition.

Rashtramata Indira Gandhi Arts commerce and science college Jalna on has adequate facility of sport as like outdoor, indoor games and yoga. In our institution we take indoor and out door games, in indoor games such as chess, caram tukayando (judo karate) etc. For outdoor game we have open sport ground nearly about 15 thousand Square feet. with audience gallary. 2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1 Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

Answer:

The college has an efficient mechanism of internal and external assessment which is transparent in the conduction and in the rectification of grievances. The grievances are solved with almost priority with a time-bound manner. The college strictly follows the guidelines of the affiliated university while conducting the internal assessment and end-semester examinations. It recognizes evaluation as a benchmark for efficient teaching-learning process, which should enhance innovative and higher order thinking amongst learners and inspire to accomplish the measurable goals. The process of evaluation is student oriented and supportive to provide hassle free ambience for the students. In this regard, the college has developed a structured mechanism to deal with examination related grievances in a transparent, time-bound and efficient manner. The college has established Grievance **Redressal** Committee, College Internal and External Examination Committee and appointed Chief Superintendent for the university examinations to provide support to the students to resolve the issues related to internal and external examination. Broadly, there are two assessments: (1) Comprehensive External Examination (CEE) and (2) Continuous Internal Assessment (CIA). The

CEE is controlled by the affiliated university. The role of the institution is to be implemented as per the directions of the affiliating University. The exam-related activities of CEE such as the preparation of question papers, exam supervision, answer-sheet evaluation, result declaration, etc. are carried out by the affiliating university. All information related to CEE is communicated in advance, and the same is communicated to the students.

The college has taken the following measures to achieve transparency in the Internal Assessment Process:

- A well planned exam schedule in the College Calendar.
- Consolidation and calculation of CIA explained to students.
- The CIA schedule and question paper patterns are circulated to the students.
- The evaluated answer scripts are distributed.
- The final 'internal mark' is verified and signed by the students. A copy is displayed on the notice board.

MECHANISM FOR GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL: The College is keen to address grievances related to assessments (both CEE and CIA). Students have multiple channels to raise their grievances including head of the department, controller of examinations, Principal, and the web portal. The grievances are classified into College and University levels to take appropriate action.

COLLEGE-LEVEL: The faculties concerned distribute the answer sheets of internal examination among students and collect their grievances if any. If a student raises that the marks he/she scored for any paper is not up to his/her expectations, the student can opt for revaluation through an application within seven days of declaring results. The students can also make use of the web portal or suggestion box, Principal, IQAC, and Controller of Examination. The size of one class room is near about 600 square feet. In our institution there are total **22 No of computers** in which 10 computers are used for college office work with Mastersoft ERP solutions Pvt. Ltd facility and 12 Computers are used for student in Computer Lab with 40 MBPS speed of Wi-fi. We used Late. Shrimantrao Mundhe Open Auditorium with measuring area is 6250 Sq. feet for taking various cultural programmes such as Gathering, Ifthar party, Debatie Competition, Social Justice Lecturer Series etc. We have 02 LCD Projector, 02 printers, 02 scanner, 01 Digital Camera, 01 Xerox Machine, 02 Web Cameras, 11 CCTV Cameras, 01 Inverter and 01 Generator for smooth teaching, learning and evalution process.

Institution has good facility for sports like kabbadi, kho-kho, running, cricket etc, for outdoor games. We organised indoor games Judo, Taekwondo, Carrom, Chess competitions at university, district, intercollege and state level. We have facility for Yoga. For **outdoor games** we have open sports ground nearly about **15000 Sq. feet** with audience gallary. This sports ground is now available for taking College, university, State level various games such as **Kabbadi**, **Volleyball, Wrestling, Discus Throw, Javelin Throw, Long Jump and High Jump.** We are also taking competition such as 100 meter, 500 meter and 1000 meter running on the ground of Jalna District Sports Complex. - 7. The college has **Girls' Common Room** with basic medicine and first aid kit.
- 8. The College is also having **Hirkani kaksh** (Feeding Room) for new born child and mother.

Thus, under the Gender Sensitization Cell and Internal Complaint Committee (Women's Grievance Cell), it is planned to focus attention on issues/problems related to the teenage girl students. This is because these students have been remaining under stress and suffer some socio-psychological problem. We also provide **sanitary pad** to the girls through Womens Grievance Cell. It is also planned to organize workshop for creating gender sensitization among the male students.
